

Research Opportunity

Healthy children or adults (ages 8 and above) without neurologic or developmental diagnoses and/or their caregivers are needed to participate in a research study.

WHY: This research is being done to find risk factors for chronic pain in people with CP. We are also looking at effects of pain on function, independence, and quality of life in people with CP.

BENEFITS: There is no medical benefit or significant risk to you from being in this study. The primary benefit is to gain new knowledge.

WHEN: Participants will be asked to complete online questionnaires at your convenience.

WHAT: Participants will be emailed links to online questionnaires that will take 30-60 minutes to complete. The questions will be about medical diagnoses, quality of life, and other factors that might influence pain. Participants will receive \$10 for completing all questionnaires.
