TRAINEE ROLE AT MEANINGFUL COMMUNITY SERVICES • As a trainee at Meaningful Community Services, I attended, created, and presented the Daily Professional Developments. During these presentations, interns learn about a variety of topics ranging from physical and mental health to safety in the community.

• In the community, I met with interns at locations such as shopping malls and cafes. We practiced job and personal development activities. This could mean making a resume, applying for a job, practicing how to order at a restaurant, and making change.

• During my admin time, I complete daily notes about the interns' progress each day. Each day, I may work with a different intern. The daily notes help to track their activities and progress.

• On Fridays, we meet as a community during lunch. During these sessions, all community members from Project SEARCH and CORE Foundations join a Zoom meeting to learn about different topics. We also work together in small groups in breakout rooms. As a trainee, I have led the entire group and the individual breakout rooms
