NEURODIVERSITY AT WORK RESPONSIBILITIES

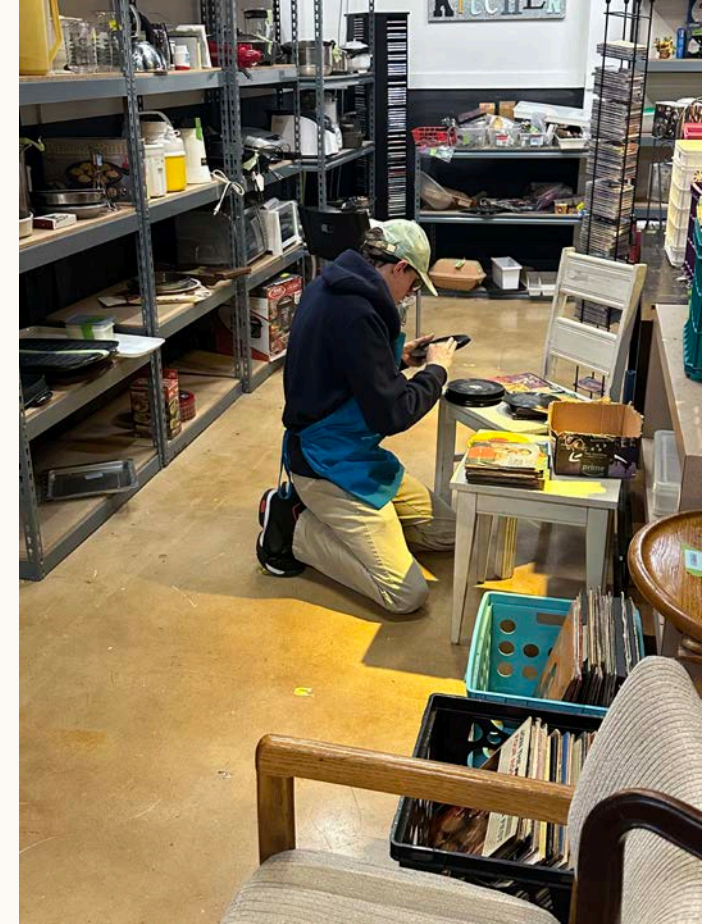
- Encouraging members to engage in volunteer activities and other community-based activities

NEW SKILLS



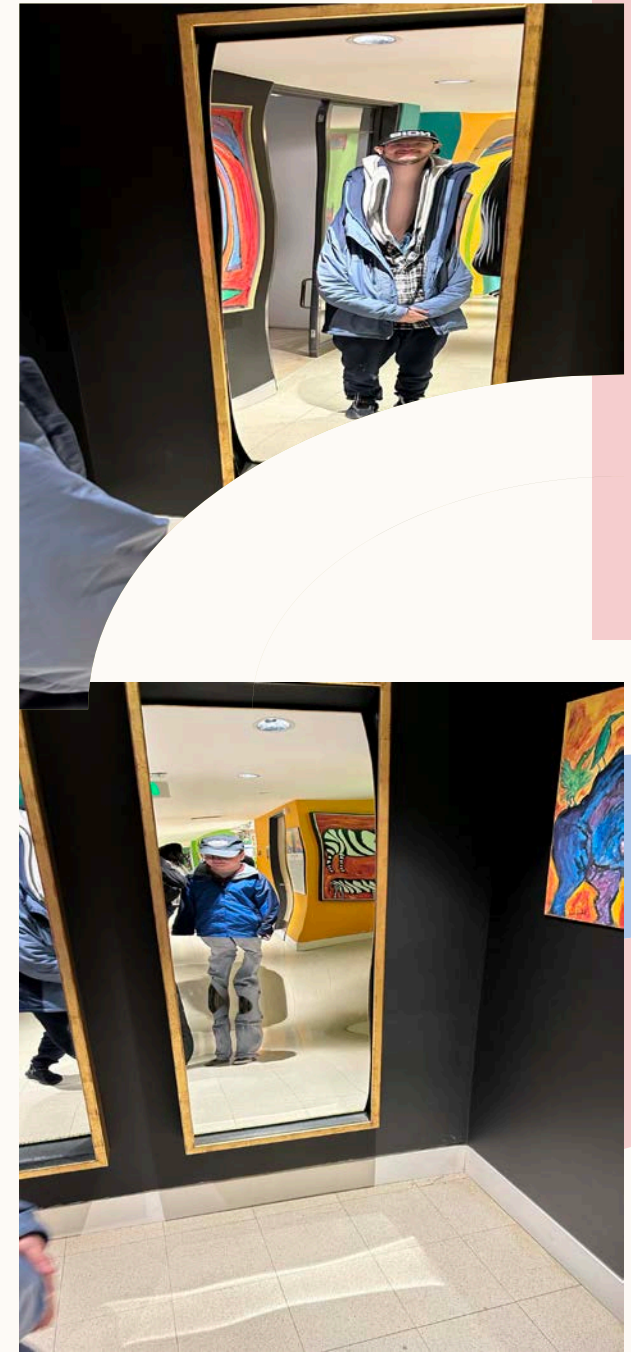
